



- Brahms' music is deeply influenced by folk and Gypsy music.
- Brahms didn't work quickly and was a perfectionist.
- Brahms happily gave money to help friends and inspiring musicians
- When he wasn't composing Brahms liked walking
- Brahms was apparently quite grumpy although he did have a lot of friends.
- Brahms died aged 63. It was almost a month to the day after hearing a performance of his 4th and final symphony.
