



Percussion Playing Techniques and Terms

Roll: A technique used by drummers to produce a constant sound on the drum.

Ghost Notes: These are usually played in-between louder notes to add a richer feel to the piece.

Bass drum pedal: Used to kick the bass drum.

Brooms: A drum stick that features many small sticks pulled together.



Brushes: A drum stick made of fanned out wires.



Cross stick: Cross sticking is when you hit the stick on the rim of the drum.

Drum skin: Covers the ends of a drum. Batter skin is the side of the drum you hit and the Resonator skin on the other side allows the sound to resonate.

Mallets: A drum stick with a tip that can be made from fabric, rubber, plastic or wood.

Snare Wires: The metal coils stretched across a snare drum.
