- **Sehyogue Aulakh** and **Lila Bhattacherjee** appointed as Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra's first **BSO Young Associates**.
- The aspiring community music leaders will gain the skills to deliver life-empowering projects with people of all ages as part of the BSO's award-winning team.
- The nine-month bursary-supported placements are designed to increase diversity in the sector, offering the next generation of community music leaders a career springboard through practical experience, training and mentoring.

Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra (BSO) announces the appointment of two talented musicians, who become its first BSO Young Associates. Sehyogue Aulakh and Lila Bhattacherjee will work with community groups in education, health and care settings throughout the South West during their nine-month placements.



**Sehyogue Aulakh**, a percussionist from Devon who is currently completing her studies at Royal Birmingham Conservatoire, joins London-born flautist **Lila Bhattacherjee** — a postgraduate student at Cardiff's Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama — in becoming a BSO Young Associate.

The pair will bring their musicality and training to community groups throughout the South West as they join Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra's award-winning outreach team. They'll experience the full range of the organisation's participation work, helping those both young and old in a variety of projects.

**Sehyogue Aulakh, BSO Young Associate musician,** said, "I feel lucky to have been exposed to a rich mix of music whilst growing up, thanks to Plymouth Music Zone, which helped me develop an interest in orchestral music alongside my love of North Indian classical music. I'm really looking forward to exploring how music can have a positive impact on people's lives, whilst developing my tool kit as a musician."

**Lila Bhattacherjee, BSO Young Associate musician,** said, "Since discovering the world of community music through my first graduate job, I've developed a deep interest and appreciation for the field. I can't wait to develop my skills as a facilitator further and connect musically and socially with people across the South West as a BSO Young Associate."

**Bea Hankey, Head of BSO Participate,** said, "We're proud that coming out of the pandemic — at a time when the empowering impact of music has never been needed more — the BSO has been able to create these opportunities for the next generation of community music leaders. We're grateful to our loyal philanthropic community, who helped fund the programme through the Big Give campaign, and for additional support from Allianz Musical Insurance. I know that Sehyogue and Lila will bring a fresh insight and energy to the brilliant work of BSO Participate — we can't wait to begin."

[i]At the last count, it was reported that people who identify as disabled, or who are from Black, Asian or Ethnically Diverse backgrounds, accounted for just 7% and 13% of those working in the UK's creative industries respectively [1] alongside this, despite representing just under one-third of the UK's national workforce, those from working class backgrounds accounted for just 16% of those working in the creative sector [2].

Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra has created its BSO Young Associates programme as a direct response, raising funds through the Big Give Christmas Challenge to help support two aspiring musicians who are underrepresented in the arts to launch a career.

- a. [1] "The total percentage figures for the National Portfolio workforce show those who are Black, Asian or Ethnically Diverse at 13%, Female at 50%, Disabled people at 7% and LGBT at 8%. These compare to the Office of National Statistics for the percentage of the working age population in England: 17% ethnic minorities, 50% female, 22% Disabled people and 2% LGBT." The Orchestra's inaugural livestreamed series, which featured Sir John Eliot Gardiner, Benjamin Grosvenor and Alina Ibragimova, was widely praised by audiences and critics alike, with **the BSO making history as one of the first British orchestras to return to the stage in 2020**. In 2021, **Horn player Felix Klieser** made a memorable UK concerto debut as the Orchestra's Artist-in-Residence, and the BSO resumed its symphonic touring of the South West.

Committed to new music, the Orchestra celebrates a triptych of contemporary symphonic works written by women in its forthcoming season, with premiere performances of works by Carmen Ho, Franghiz Ali-Zadeh and Elizabeth Ogonek. During the pandemic, the BSO also gave premieres by composers Shirley J. Thompson OBE and Magnus Lindberg.
